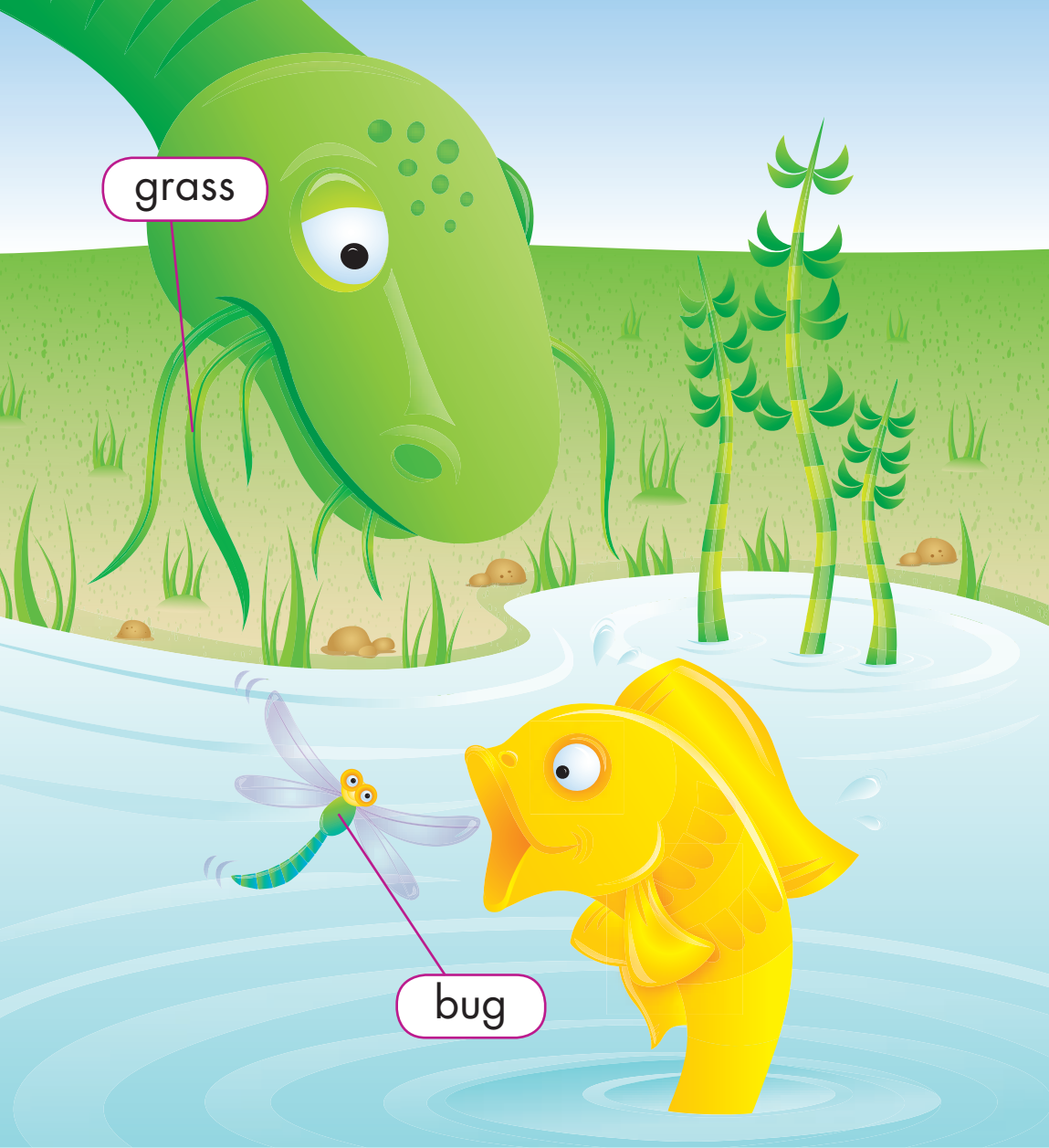


Dinosaurs live outside the lake.  
Fish live inside the lake.

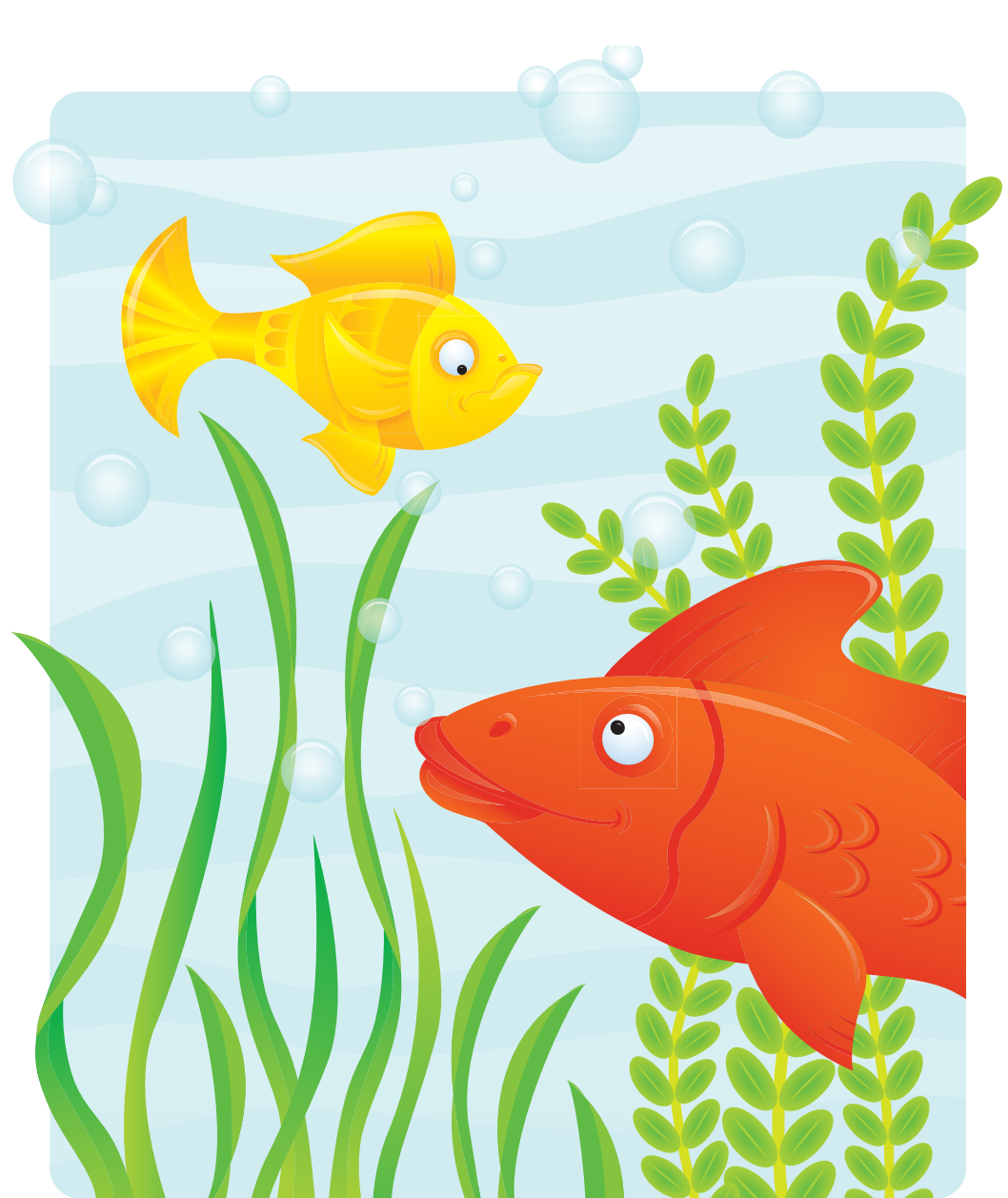


Big fish and little fish are in the lake.

Yellow fish jumps up to eat a bug.



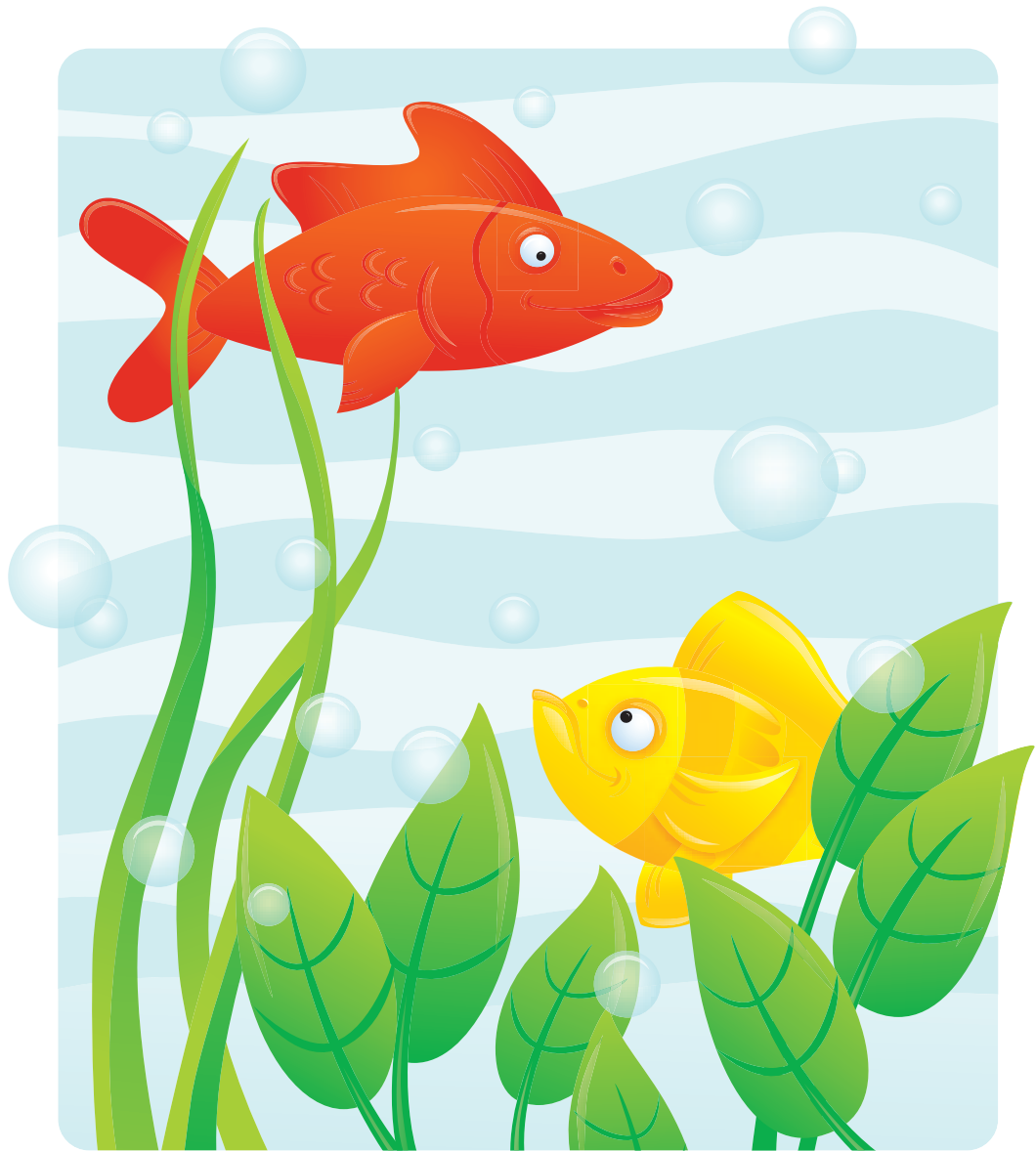
Red fish swims in the lake.  
Yellow fish swims in the lake.





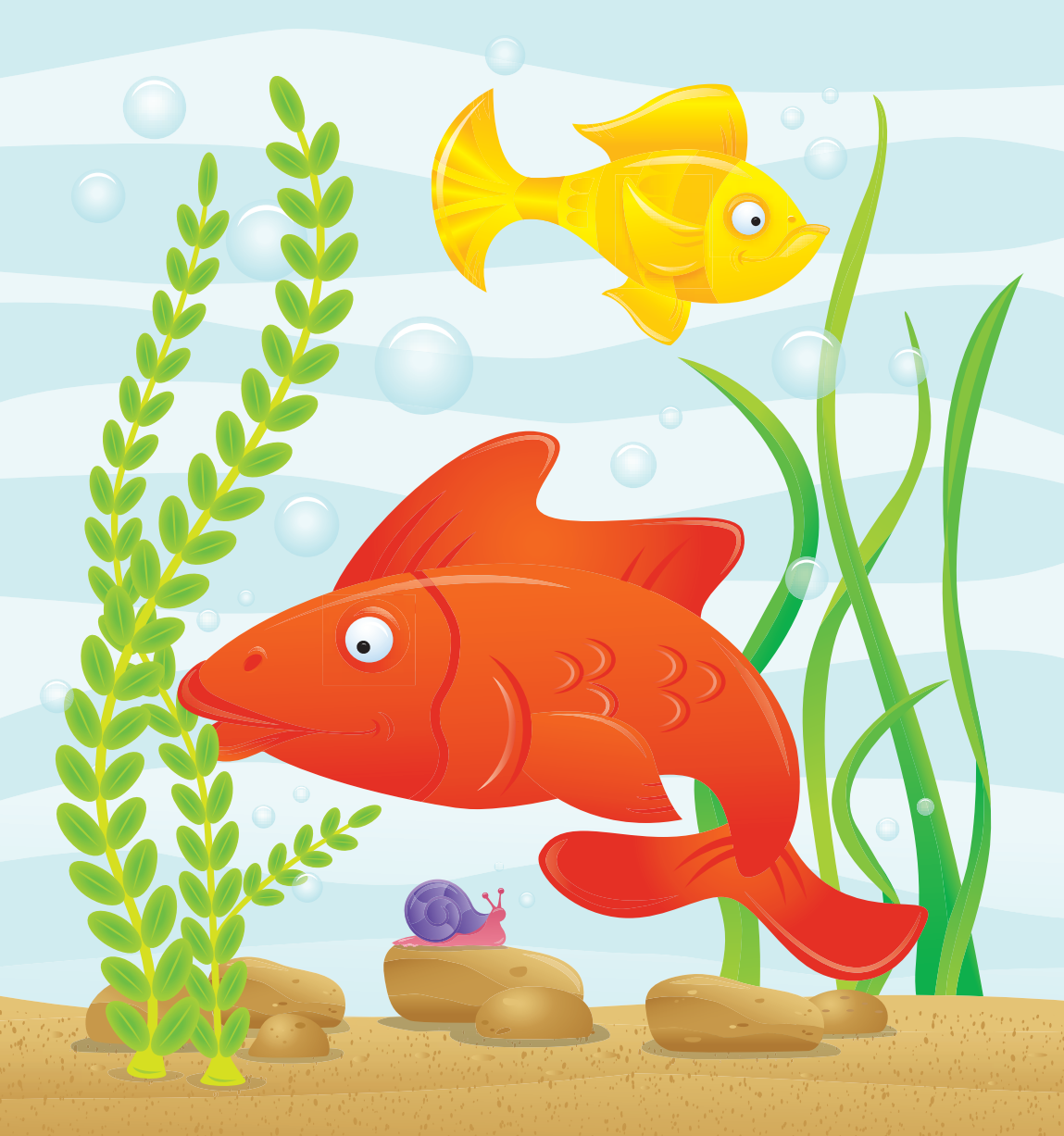


Red fish wants to eat.
